
OVERVIEW

The Screwball Science Easter Special is an Easter program that combines humor, songs, science projects, and dramatic scripture readings to create a playful presentation of the Easter story.

Dr. Hairball and Dr. Lipschtick are the screwball scientists, as brilliant at comedy as they are at science. They love to use science to explain truths about faith, the Bible, and God. When a skeptical scientist named Dr. Greasestain joins them for their Easter program, they pull out all the stops to show the unbelieving scientist that the miracle of Easter is real!

All scriptures are taken from the NIV translation of the Bible.









MATERIALS NEEDED

PROPS:

A table A hard boiled egg (cracked and peeled) An old milk bottle Matches Birthday candles Four dozen eggs in cartons An easter basket A glass jar Acetone Strips of styrofoam A table Jelly marbles A clear bowl A pitcher of water

COSTUMES SUGGESTION:

Lab coats for the doctors Biblical costumes for Bible characters (Note: for the crucifixion scene, have Jesus and the thieves dress in all black rather than do a dramatic portrayal of the crucifixion)

CHARACTERS

Dr. Hairball and Dr. Lipschtick - The "Screwball Scientists" Dr. Greasestain - A skeptic Narrator Jesus Jesus' Disciples People of Jerusalem Servant of the High Priest Peter Two Thieves A Roman soldier

Character Note: If you have a large number of students who want to participate you can always have additional students play the people of Jerusalem as well as additional Roman soldiers.

SCENE ONE



Dr. Hairball and Lipschtick enter.

HAIRBALL: Good evening everyone, and welcome to the Screwball Science Easter Special! I am Dr. Hairball, and with me as always is my assistant, Dr. Lipschtick.

LIPSCHTICK: Hello!

HAIRBALL: Today, we're going to do a series of experiments about our favorite holiday.

LIPSCHTICK: Arbor Day!

HAIRBALL: Arbor Day?

LIPSCHTICK: Yes, Arbor Day, the day we celebrate trees by planting more trees.

HAIRBALL: Your favorite holiday is Arbor Day?

LIPSCHTICK: And if you're really good all year, and you leave an empty pot by your nightstand, the Arbor Day Gnu will deposit a fresh tree shrub in the pot you can plant yourself.

HAIRBALL: That is the silliest thing I've ever heard. But that's not the holiday I am referring to. I'm talking about Easter!

LIPSCHTICK: Easter?

HAIRBALL: Yes, Easter!

LIPSCHTICK: Ohhhh, so that's why this is the Easter special?

HAIRBALL: Very good, Lipschtick!

LIPSCHTICK: Thank you.

HAIRBALL: And to celebrate our favorite holiday, we're going to do what we do best.

LIPSCHTICK: The Macarena.

HAIRBALL: (pause) Okay, we're going to do what we do second best.

LIPSCHTICK: Play air hockey.

HAIRBALL: Okay, we're going to do what we do third best.

LIPSCHTICK: Science experiments!

SCENE ONE

HAIRBALL: There we go!

Dr. Greasestain enters.

GREASESTAIN: Hold it! Hold it! Just a minute! You can't do science experiments for Easter.

HAIRBALL: Why not?

GREASESTAIN: Because Easter is about faith. And everybody knows that science and faith do not mix.

LIPSCHTICK: Oh no? And who are you that knows so much about faith and science?

GREASESTAIN: I am Dr. Hugo Greasestain, and I don't believe in Easter!

LIPSCHTICK: You what???

HAIRBALL: Steady, Dr. Lipschtick. It's okay. Dr. Greasestain, I understand your doubts about science and even Easter. But I assure you, science and faith can go hand in hand. In fact I know they do!

GREASESTAIN: How is that possible?

HAIRBALL: Because I believe God created science!

GREASESTAIN: What? Well, I never thought of that before. But still, how can you believe in miracles? And this resurrection? And even God himself?

HAIRBALL: Dr. Greasestain, I would love to tell you all about it. So how about you stick around, while we share the Easter story, some Easter songs, and a few science experiments that will teach us about Easter?

GREASESTAIN: All right, but this had better be good! The scientists exit.

SCENE TWO

The narrator enters.

NARR: (from Mark 11:1-10) As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.'"

They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

The Narrator exits. The people of Jerusalem (kids chorus) enter with palm branches. Jesus passes by as they sing for him.

SONG 1 - "Holy Holy Holy"

After the song, the kids chorus exits.

SCENE THREE

Prior to this scene, set the milk bottle, the egg, the paper, and the matches on the table. Be sure to grease the top of the bottle with vegetable oil. Hairball, Lipschtick, and Greasestain enter.

HAIRBALL: Welcome back to Screwball Science. Are we ready to get to our first experiment?

LIPSCHTICK: Yes we are!

GREASESTAIN: I can hardly wait.

HAIRBALL: You know, Dr. Greasestain, Easter is a special holiday. It's a day when we celebrate something impossible.

GREASESTAIN: Like a rabbit laying eggs?

HAIRBALL: No.

GREASESTAIN: Like a rabbit hiding billions of eggs in one night?

HAIRBALL: I was referring to how God saved us from our sins.

GREASESTAIN: Sins? What are sins?

LIPSCHTICK: You know, all the bad stuff we do.

GREASESTAIN: I never do any bad stuff.

LIPSCHTICK: You've never lied to your Mom about where you were going? Or taken a piece of candy that didn't belong to you? Or burped at the dinner table and blamed it on your brother?

GREASESTAIN: Okay, I might have done a few of those things.

HAIRBALL: The Bible tells us that our God is perfect. And when we sinned, we became separated from God. So how can a perfect God pay the price for an imperfect people?

GREASESTAIN: It can't be done!

HAIRBALL: It has been done!

GREASESTAIN: But that's impossible!

Lipschtick lifts the bottle and the egg, setting the egg on top of the bottle.

LIPSCHTICK: As impossible as slipping this egg into this old milk bottle?

GREASESTAIN: What? No way! That's impossible.



SCENE THREE

HAIRBALL: You think so, huh?

GREASESTAIN: Oh that's definitely impossible. The egg is too large! You can't fit it inside the bottle.

HAIRBALL: Not only will I make this egg go inside the bottle, I will do it upside down.

GREASESTAIN: No way!!

HAIRBALL: First, we put two birthday candles into the top of the egg.

GREASESTAIN: Eww, I don't want a birthday egg. I want birthday cake!

HAIRBALL: Next, we light the candles.

Lipschtick lights the candles.

LIPSCHTICK: Shall we sing "Happy Birthday?"

HAIRBALL: Only if you want to pay for it!

LIPSCHTICK: Then we better skip it.

HAIRBALL: Now, Dr. Greasestain? Place the mouth of the bottle over the candles on top of the egg, sealing the bottle shut.

GREASESTAIN: Okay, here goes.

Greasestain places the bottle over top of the egg. Watch and wait for the candles to go out and suck the egg inside the bottle.

HAIRBALL: You did it!

GREASESTAIN: I don't believe it! The egg, it just got sucked right in there! But how??

HAIRBALL: That my friend is exactly what people said when Jesus said he could defeat death by coming back to life. They said, "That's impossible, that can never happen!" But that's why Jesus came to Earth.

LIPSCHTICK: To open the door so we can all have our sins forgiven!

HAIRBALL: Precisely! Jesus did the impossible, and for that, he deserves all our praise.

GREASESTAIN: That's a pretty cool trick, but I'm still not convinced Jesus really did the impossible.

SCENE THREE

LIPSCHTICK: That's okay, Dr. Greasestain. We've only just begun to tell you that story.

HAIRBALL: You can say that again.

LIPSCHTICK: That's okay, Dr. Greasestain. We've only just begun to tell you that story.

GREASESTAIN: Well you have my attention. Tell me.

HAIRBALL: Well, it all begins in Jerusalem. Jesus has just shared the Passover meal with his friends, the disciples, and he's led them out to a quiet garden to pray.

The scientists exit. The kid chorus enters.

SONG 2 - "Were You There When They Crucified My Lord"

The kids chorus exits.

SCENE FOUR

The Narrator enters.

NARRATOR: (*From Mark 14:32-72*) They went to a place called Gethsemane, and Jesus said to his disciples, "Sit here while I pray." He took Peter, James and John along with him, and he began to be deeply distressed and troubled. "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death," he said to them. "Stay here and keep watch." Going a little farther, he fell to the ground and prayed that if possible the hour might pass from him. "Father," he said, "everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."

Judas, one of the Twelve, appeared. With him was a crowd armed with swords and clubs, sent from the chief priests, the teachers of the law, and the elders. Going at once to Jesus, Judas said, "Rabbi!" and kissed him. The men seized Jesus and arrested him. They took Jesus to the high priest, and all the chief priests, the elders and the teachers of the law came together.

Peter enters, lurking, as if watching Jesus' trial from afar.

NARR: Peter, one of the twelve, followed him at a distance, right into the courtyard of the high priest. There he sat with the guards and warmed himself at the fire. Just a few hours before, Jesus had warned Peter that he would deny Jesus three times. While Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the servant girls of the high priest came by.

The Servant enters.

SERVANT: You also were with that Nazarene, Jesus. Weren't you?

PETER: I don't know or understand what you're talking about.

Peter turns away from her. She looks closer.

SERVANT: You are one of them. I recognize you! This fellow is one of them.

PETER: No! I'm not one of his followers! I never saw him before today!

SERVANT: Surely you are one of them, for you are a Galilean.

PETER: I tell you I don't know the man! I've never seen him before today! I don't know this man you're talking about!!

NARRATOR: Immediately the rooster crowed. Then Peter remembered the word Jesus had spoken to him: "Before the rooster crows twice you will disown me three times." And he broke down and wept.

Peter runs off in tears. The Servant girl and Narrator exit.

Prior to this scene, set the eggs on the table. Hairball, Lipschtick, and Greasestain enter.

HAIRBALL: Well doctors, we've come to what I think is one of the saddest parts of the whole Easter story.

LIPSCHTICK: The part where Jesus dies?

HAIRBALL: No, this is before that.

LIPSCHTICK: The part where Judas betrays him?

HAIRBALL: After that.

LIPSCHTICK: The part where the crowds that welcomed him on Palm Sunday turn on him and demand the governor release a hardened criminal instead of Jesus?

HAIRBALL: Not that part either.

LIPSCHTICK: Well, you better just tell me, because there are a lot of sad parts to this story.

HAIRBALL: I am speaking of the part where Peter denies knowing Jesus.

LIPSCHTICK: Ohhhhh that is a sad part. Peter told Jesus he wasn't afraid to die with him. He wanted to be so brave! And then he turns around and denies ever knowing Jesus three times!

GREASESTAIN: That was one of Jesus' close friends? That was the man who promised to follow Jesus all the way until death? How am I supposed to believe in Jesus when he doesn't even believe?

HAIRBALL: You make a good argument, Dr. Greasestain. If anyone should have had the courage to stand up for Jesus in that darkest of hours, it was Peter. Peter was one of the first disciples. He saw all the big miracles. Turning water into wine. Feeding the 5000. Raising Lazarus from the dead. And then when he has the chance to take a stand for Jesus, he turns chicken.

LIPSCHTICK: I thought it was a rooster.

HAIRBALL: What?

LIPSCHTICK: Never mind.

GREASESTAIN: So much for faith, huh?

HAIRBALL: Yes, faith. If only Peter had remembered the faith and courage it took to walk on the water, maybe he could have resisted his fear.

GREASESTAIN: Wait, did you say walk on water? HAIRBALL: Yes I did. GREASESTAIN: That's crazy. Nobody can walk on water. HAIRBALL: They can if they have faith. LIPSCHTICK: Why it's as easy as walking on raw eggs! Hairball opens the egg cartons and sets them on stage in front of the table in a walking path. GREASESTAIN: What? Walk on eggs? That's crazy. HAIRBALL: And you're just the man crazy enough to do it. GREASESTAIN: What? Me? No way, Jose! Not gonna happen! LIPSCHTICK: Okay, first guy with their shoes off wins. GREASESTAIN: It's not gonna be me because I'm not gonna take-Hairball and Lipschtick tackle Greasestain and start to pull his shoes off. LIPSCHTICK: Hey!! Let go of me! HAIRBALL: Come on, doctor! Don't be afraid! GREASESTAIN: I'm not afraid! I just don't want egg on my feet! LIPSCHTICK: This is happening, Dr. Greasestain! Come on, you'll love it! GREASESTAIN: No I won't! HAIRBALL: Just trust us, it will work! They toss the shoes aside. Greasestain stands up. LIPSCHTICK: It's real simple. Just put your whole foot on one dozen, then the next, then the next.

GREASESTAIN: No!

HAIRBALL: Please?

GREASESTAIN: I don't wanna walk on eggs!



HAIRBALL: You have to do it! For the kids!

GREASESTAIN: No!

HAIRBALL: For science!

GREASESTAIN: No!

HAIRBALL: Dr. Greasestain, listen to me. If you were to step on one egg, what would happen?

GREASESTAIN: It would go squish!

HAIRBALL: Exactly! But science tells us that when you step onto a crate of eggs and distribute your weight evenly over the eggs, the eggs will not break.

GREASESTAIN: It does, huh?

LIPSCHTICK: We wouldn't fib about science.

GREASESTAIN: Okay, but if this doesn't work, you owe me a new pair of socks!

HAIRBALL: Deal.

GREASESTAIN: Okay, here goes nothing!

Lipschtick composes himself, takes a deep breath, and then walks across the eggs.

HAIRBALL: You did it, doctor! You actually did it!

GREASESTAIN: I can't believe it! I walked on eggs!

HAIRBALL: Just like Peter walked on water!

GREASESTAIN: I was so afraid, but I trusted you and I made it.

LIPSCHTICK: Imagine if you trusted in God like that!

GREASESTAIN: You mean like your boy, Peter?

HAIRBALL: You know, doctor, Peter regained his faith after Jesus rose from the grave. He became a leader in the new church. He was brave enough to face jail and even death so he could tell people about Jesus!

GREASESTAIN: Really? I guess he didn't stay a chicken.



LIPSCHTICK: I thought it was a rooster.

HAIRBALL: When we have faith, we can find the courage to do anything. Just like Jesus found the courage to die for us.

The scientists exit.



SCENE SIX

The Narrator enters. Jesus enters and stands at center, arms outstretched. The two thieves enter, one on either side of Jesus, and stretch their arms out.

NARRATOR: (from Luke 23:33-47) When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified Jesus there, along with two criminals—one on his right, the other on his left. Jesus said:

JESUS: Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.

NARRATOR: They divided up his clothes by casting lots. The people stood watching, and the rulers even sneered at him. They said, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is God's Messiah, the Chosen One." The soldiers also came up and mocked him. They offered him wine vinegar and said, "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself." There was a written notice above him, which read: This is the king of the Jews.

THIEF: Aren't you the Messiah? Isn't that why they are crucifying you? If you are the Messiah, then save yourself and us!

THIEF 2: Don't you fear God since you are under the same sentence? We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

JESUS: Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise.

The Roman soldier enters.

NARRATOR: It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Jesus called out with a loud voice,

JESUS: Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.

NARRATOR: When he had said this, he breathed his last. The centurion, seeing what had happened, praised God and said,

SOLDIER: Surely this was a righteous man.

The Narrator exits. Jesus, the thieves, and the soldier stay in place. The kids chorus enters.

SONG 3 - "The Old Rugged Cross"

The kids chorus, the soldier, Jesus, and the thieves exit.

SCENE SEVEN

Prior to this scene, pour some acetone in the glass jar and set it inside the Easter basket. Set the basket with the jar on a table along with the styrofoam. Hairball, Lipschtick, and Greasestain enter.

GREASESTAIN: Wow. I have to admit, that was quite a moving scene. The thief on the cross sure sounded sorry for all of his, what did you call those things?

LIPSCHTICK: Sins.

GREASESTAIN: And it sounds to me like Jesus forgave him!

HAIRBALL: He did forgive him!

GREASESTAIN: But why? Why would Jesus even care about that man? He was a thief!

LIPSCHTICK: Ah, but he was also a child of God, just like you and me. And that is the whole reason Jesus came to Earth. It's the reason he was born at Christmas.

HAIRBALL: Christmas? Did someone say Christmas?

LIPSCHTICK: I did say Christmas!

HAIRBALL: I'm glad you did, because this next experiment, we're going to show you how to get rid of all that styrofoam packaging left over from Christmas.

GREASESTAIN: Christmas? I thought this was about Easter!

HAIRBALL: Dr. Lipschtick, is your house still full of styrofoam packaging from the Christmas holiday?

LIPSCHTICK: Are you kidding? It's everywhere!

HAIRBALL: It's too bulky for the trashcan. You can't recycle it.

LIPSCHTICK: How do I get rid of it?

HAIRBALL: Watch this!

Hairball takes a strip of styrofoam and lowers it into the jar inside the Easter basket.

GREASESTAIN: What? Where did it go? Is this some magic trick? Some form of wizardry?

HAIRBALL: I assure you this is no trick, and no act of magic.

GREASESTAIN: Let me see you do that again!

SCENE SEVEN

Hairball does it again. Greasestain looks under the table.

GREASESTAIN: The styrofoam! It's completely gone! But how is that possible? Could it be that Easter baskets eat styrofoam?

HAIRBALL: Nope!

GREASESTAIN: I got it! The styrofoam is fertilizer to make the plastic Easter grass grow!

HAIRBALL: No, sir!

GREASESTAIN: Then tell me!

HAIRBALL: Acetone!

LIPSCHTICK: Bless you.

HAIRBALL: Acetone is a chemical that dissolved styrofoam. A chemical reaction takes place when the styrofoam touches the acetone, and the styrofoam disappears!

GREASESTAIN: That's amazing!

HAIRBALL: And it reminds me of one of the most amazing things I learned from the Bible. Just like this styrofoam, God wants to make all our sins disappear!

GREASESTAIN: So you mean to tell me that when Jesus told the thief he would be in paradise, he actually erases all those sins?

LIPSCHTICK: (lowering more styrofoam into the jar) He made them all disappear!

GREASESTAIN: Well isn't that clever? I guess this experiment wasn't about Christmas after all, was it?

HAIRBALL: No! Well, maybe just a little. They put a lot of styrofoam in the packaging on the new Star Wars toys this year.

LIPSCHTICK: Tell me about it.

HAIRBALL: But now, all that styrofoam is gone, just like my sins.

LIPSCHTICK: And my sins!

GREASESTAIN: And maybe my sins too?

HAIRBALL: Careful, doctor. I think you're starting to believe!



SCENE SEVEN



GREASESTAIN: Maybe I am. But I wanna know how the story ends first.
LIPSCHTICK: Spoiler alert: it is a happy ending!
GREASESTAIN: You mean, Jesus really does come back to life?
HAIRBALL: Oh yes, and wait until you see how the disciples take it! *The scientists exit.*



SCENE EIGHT

The disciples all enter. The Narrator enters.

NARRATOR: (from Luke 24:36-49) While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them

JESUS: Peace be with you.

The disciples all jump and scream, afraid!

NARRATOR: They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost.

JESUS: Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have.

NARRATOR: When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet.

JESUS: This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms.

NARRATOR: Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high. Jesus and the Narrator exit. The kids chorus enters.

SONG 4 - "UP FROM THE GRAVE HE AROSE"

The kids chorus exits.

SCENE NINE

Prior to this scene, set a bowl full of jelly marbles and a pitcher of water on stage. Hairball and Lipschtick enter.

HAIRBALL: Well, fellas, Easter is finally here.

LIPSCHTICK: At last, Easter Sunday! Time to chow down on Cadbury Eggs. Chocolate bunnies. Cadbury Eggs. Peeps. Cadbury Eggs. Jelly Beans. Cadbury Eggs. Cadbury Eggs. Cadbury Eggs.

HAIRBALL: Sounds like a lot of Cadbury Eggs to me.

LIPSCHTICK: I like what I like, Hairball. It's not easy waiting until Easter Sunday to get my Cadbury Eggs from you know who, but when the day finally comes, I eat them like crazy.

GREASESTAIN: You do know that Cadbury Eggs can be found at any grocery store or drug store, right?

LIPSCHTICK: They what?

GREASESTAIN: It's true! They've been on sale at Walgreens since... well, the day after Christmas.

LIPSCHTICK: Are you kidding me?? I could have been eating Cadbury Eggs in January??

HAIRBALL: Sorry, pal.

LIPSCHTICK: This is the worst day ever!

HAIRBALL: Dr. Lipschtick, I'm surprised at you. This day is not about chocolate eggs. It's about Jesus!

LIPSCHTICK: You're right, Hairball, and that brings us to today's experiment. This is one of my favorites too.

HAIRBALL: Then why don't you do it?

LIPSCHTICK: Okay, I will. Dr. Greasestain, take a look at this bowl. This bowl is filled with these little rubbery, bouncy things called jelly marbles. Can you see those?

GREASESTAIN: I can see them!

LIPSCHTICK: Let's pretend these marbles are Jesus, who died on Good Friday and was buried in a tomb. In fact, we're going to call this bowl here Jesus' tomb.

HAIRBALL: Don't call it a tomb. I eat my Lucky Charms in that bowl!



SCENE NINE

LIPSCHTICK: For three days, Jesus was buried in the tomb. But what happened on Easter Sunday? Lipschtick pours water over the marbles. GREASESTAIN: Hey! The marbles, where did they go? LIPSCHTICK: Come Sunday, Jesus was gone. The tomb was empty! No body in the tomb! GREASESTAIN: Did you say nobody or no body? LIPSCHTICK: Neither! There was no one and no body in the tomb! GREASESTAIN: It was empty? LIPSCHTICK: Yes! HAIRBALL: Of course it was. Jesus is alive. Death could not hold him forever because he is the Son of God! Jesus died to give us new life, and if we believe in him... LIPSCHTICK: We will have eternal life! HAIRBALL: Exactly. GREASESTAIN: So you fellas really believe that Jesus is alive? HAIRBALL: Yes! GREASESTAIN: You believe he's the Son of God? LIPSCHTICK: Affirmative! GREASESTAIN: You believe he died for the sins of the whole world? Even mine? HAIRBALL: Roger that! GREASESTAIN: And if I believe in him... I can live eternally? LIPSCHTICK: Believe it. It's no... (pulls out an egg) yolk! GREASESTAIN: Hehe, I get it. That's a good joke. LIPSCHTICK: A good joke on a good day to celebrate the good news. Jesus is risen! The kids chorus enters. **PAGE 20**

SCENE NINE

SONG 5 - "CHRIST THE LORD IS RISEN TODAY"

After the song, Dr. Greasestain returns with the four egg cartons. He sets them down on the stage, lining them up.

HAIRBALL: What's going on. Dr. Greasestain?

LIPSCHTICK: Hey, are those my eggs? I was gonna make omelettes.

GREASESTAIN: Just had to revisit this experiment one more time.

HAIRBALL: I'm Dr. Hairball.


LIPSCHTICK: I'm Dr. Lipschtick.


